Cameron's Island Sightseeing in Yakushima

I recently decided to take a cheap flight to Kagoshima to have my first experience visiting Kyushu (I've finally visited every major island of Japan!). After arriving I immediately decided to explore so I took a boat to Sakurajima. This is a nearby island that can be seen from the city and was created by a volcano that is always active.
